SCHOOL FEES

2026-2027

Welcome to the MOSAIC School Fees brochure. Here you will find all the fees related to tuition and services offered throughout the year. To provide you with a simple and transparent overview, these fees are divided into three distinct categories.

1. Compulsory fees

These correspond to the annual school fees associated with your child's enrolment and educational support. These fees form the basis of the educational programme at our school.

2. Optional costs

These relate to additional services that you can choose according to your needs, such as school meals, the Mosaic Club or other regular services offered by the school.

3. Occasional requests

These include one-off services used according to your family's needs: exceptionally a meal in the canteen, last-minute childcare or any other unforeseen need, and are billed on a case-by-case basis.

The purpose of this brochure is to enable you to easily identify the costs associated with your child's school life and to adapt your choice of services with complete peace of mind.

Compulsory fees:

1. Mosaic registration fees are the admission fees due at the time of enrolment. They are only payable once for the entire duration of the child's schooling.

2. Tuition fees represent the financial contribution necessary for the smooth running of the school.

They enable us to offer your child a rich, stimulating and high-quality school environment.

MOSAIC School offers bilingual education provided by two certified teachers, each teaching in their native language. From Early Years 1 (Pink Class) onwards, pupils also benefit from lessons given by specialist music and sports teachers.

From Early Years 2 (Yellow Class) onwards, theatre classes are added to the curriculum.

From 4P onwards, the educational offering is further enriched with the introduction of German, and with science from 5P onwards, in order to support each child on a comprehensive learning journey that is open to the world.

A 5% discount on annual tuition fees is applicable if paid in a single instalment by 15 July.

Families receive a 20% discount on tuition fees for their third child and any subsequent children. No discount is granted if tuition fees are paid by a company for one or more siblings.

3. The annual fees cover all educational activities for the current school year. These fees include school supplies and other teaching materials.

They also include:

- **the creation and acquisition of bilingual teaching materials**, developed in-house and also imported from the United Kingdom to ensure the quality and consistency of our educational resources.
- **school trips**: one class trip, two trips to shows, museums or classroom activities, and one civic awareness trip, making a total of four class events per year.
- **the cohesion trip** from 4P onwards, for which only meal costs are charged in addition. This experience plays an important role in our educational project: it strengthens cohesion between pupils, encourages their independence and broadens their learning beyond the school environment.
- **A variety of sports programmes** adapted to their age group: swimming, biathlon and access to the sports facilities at Sous-Moulin.
- **An ambitious digital project** aimed at preparing our pupils for constantly evolving technological tools. This project also includes applications designed for families to facilitate communication and strengthen the link between school and home.
- **Support** for pupils in their development by our health and well-being coordinator and our referral doctor. Our coordinator implements actions in the classroom and coordinates the intervention of external specialists when necessary.

A psychological nurse works with 4P, 6P and 8P pupils on aspects of the body that are changing.

4. Compulsory trips

Field trips with overnight stays, which are compulsory from Year 5 to Year 8, are not included in the above fees.

You should budget approximately CHF 170 per day of camp:

5P: 3-day mountain discovery trip

6P: 4-day sailing and ecology camp

7P: Five-day history/geography camp.

For 8P, the camp abroad will cost a maximum of CHF 1,500.

Prices may vary depending on the number of participants and educational projects (+/- 10%).

If the budget is exceeded, a meeting with parents will be organised to discuss the project.

5. iPad purchase

The iPad is intended to be used for a period of four years. A new device will be provided at the start of Year 5. If a pupil leaves during this four-year period, it will be possible to purchase the iPad according to the terms and conditions that will be communicated.

LANGUAGE SUPPORT PROGRAMME (depending on the child's level of language proficiency) FAST TRACK & PASSERELLE programmes

In order to enable every pupil to benefit fully from Mosaic's bilingual curriculum, the school has set up a programme to meet the needs of pupils with little or no knowledge of French and/or English.

From 1P onwards, language support in French and English is compulsory for all pupils who do not speak either French or English, and they will join the FAST TRACK programme.

From 3P onwards, linguistic support in French and/or English is compulsory for all pupils who have not spent three full years in a bilingual French/English education system, and they will join the PASSERELLE programme. At the beginning of the school year, students are tested by Mosaic to assess their level and determine the appropriate level of support they require.

The FAST TRACK Programme:

Students are divided into small groups of no more than five students. They are taken out of their class two to four times a week during school hours by a tutor of the language being reinforced.

We anticipate that a child will have oral proficiency in French and English at the end of this FAST TRACK programme, enabling them to follow lessons in class. However, depending on the assessment made by the 2P teachers, participation in the PASSERELLE programme may be necessary in 3P.

The PASSERELLE Programme:

Students are divided into small groups of no more than 5 students. They are taken out of their class 3 to 5 sessions per week during school hours by a tutor specialising in the language being reinforced.

In addition, each child benefits from a weekly homework session from 4 pm to 5 pm.

We expect that by the end of the PASSERELLE programme, children will have acquired, developed and mastered the new language to a level that will enable them to follow lessons in class.

Optional costs:

Optional costs include all additional services that you can select according to your needs, such as school meals, the Mosaic Club or other regular services offered by the school.

The fees shown are per day for the term/year. Simply multiply them by the number of days per week to get the total annual fees. For example: 3 days of school meals cost CHF 2,460 per year, including supervision.

The amounts shown are presented on a termly basis, accompanied by the corresponding annual total.

CANTEEN

The canteen offers Fourchette Verte-certified meals every day, consisting of a starter, a hot dish, a dessert and bread, to ensure a balanced and high-quality diet.

Mealtimes are supervised by teachers, ensuring a calm atmosphere conducive to a real break. During the lunch break, students enjoy activities supervised by activity leaders and teachers, with the option of visiting Bertrand Park.

The menus are available on the school website.

Particular attention is paid to respecting everyone's dietary needs, so that each student can enjoy lunch safely and with pleasure.

This is a support session: despite the assistance provided, it is possible that not all homework will be completed during the session.
